⁴ Achaia: name for the whole of Greece in Roman times.

EPHESUS: a large and important city on the west coast of Asia Minor; once a commercial, political, and religious center of western Asia where the Apostle Paul founded a church. It was prominent for its false religions having a temple to Artemis (Diana) the goddess of fertility, also temples and sanctuaries of Hestia, Serapis (an Egyptian deity), Zeus, and the Phrygian mother goddess. The city had an amphitheater where games, gladiatorial combats, and contests with wild animals were held, it had a library containing up to 15,000 rolls, and there were also six bath houses, many fountains, wells, and aqueducts; the best of achievements and the worst of debauchery. Home of one of the seven churches addressed in the Revelations to John (Revelation 2:1-7).

Holy Spirit: the Holy Spirit is with - Greek *para* - the unbeliever for conviction, comes in - Greek *en* - the believer at conversion, comes upon - Greek *epi* - the believer to empower him for service (see John 14:16, 17).

⁸ prophesied: to foretell events, divine, speak under inspiration; exercise the prophetic office.

⁹ synagogue - Greek *sunagoge*: an assemblage of persons; the meeting; the place; a congregation of Jews for worship and religious study
